'20/20' IS FRIDAY'S NO. 1 NEWSMAGAZINE IN TOTAL VIEWERS AND ADULTS 18-49

'20/20' Opens Its New Season With Its Strongest Performance in Total Viewers and Adults 25-54 in Over Three Months

On its 2025-2026 season premiere, ABC News' "20/20: He's Right Behind You" averaged 2.752 million Total Viewers, 386,000 Adults 25-54 and 277,000 Adults 18-49 on Friday, Sept. 26, 2025, based on Live+Same Day Big Data Plus Panel Program Ratings from Nielsen Media Research.

- "20/20" outdelivered the season premiere of "Dateline" in Total Viewers (+20%/+451,000 2.752 million vs. 2.301 million) and Adults 18-49 (+7%/+17,000 277,000 vs. 260,000).
- "20/20" opened its new season with its strongest performance in Total Viewers (2.752 million) and Adults 25-54 (386,000) in over 3 months since 5/30/25 and 6/6/25, respectively.
